She also found time for sports, playing on the softball team and being voted volleyball MVP this year.

Mikaela Siegel will be attending the University of Idaho in Moscow and plans

on becoming a doctor. In school she was a member of the National Honor Society, involved with Key Club, Interact Club and also hosted a high school radio show.

She was very involved in activities to help her community including Habitat for Humanity, Humane Society, Florence Food Bank and a homeless shelter with Operation Christmas Child.

An accomplished athlete, Mikaela repeated as the 4A state girls 100-meter hurdles champion, was the state champion for cross country and got to run on the winning high school 4x400 relay team at the IAAF World Championships in Portland. She has been accepted as a walk-on at the UI for track & field.

Siuslaw History

Get a History Lesson in an Old Schoolhouse (with no tests!)

Looking to dig a little deeper into the history of Siuslaw schools, Florence or even your family tree? The Siuslaw Pioneer Museum's doors are open to all.

According to volunteer Joy McCourt '55, the Kyle Memorial Research Library has Siuslaw alumni scrapbooks that include school history, Gone But Not Forgotten articles, as well as school news stories from the year 2000 to present.

Everybody loves looking

through old yearbooks but if you've misplaced yours, the museum has the majority of them on file. Or if you are looking to offload your collection, they are looking for the 1943, 47, 48, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 63, 67, 96, 2012, 13, 14 and 15 editions.

The musuem has extensive files on pioneer and prominent families, Rhododendron Festivals, businesses, buildings, organizations, schools, sports, boats and much more.

The museum operates from noon to 4 p.m. daily in the summer, Tuesday to Sunday in the winter and they are closed during January. The library is open Tuesday to Friday. Give them a call at 541-997-7884.

The iconic structure at 278 Maple Street, once known as the Callison Building, was the Florence schoolhouse that was constructed in 1904-05, preserving the local history in one of the historic locations.



Sometime during 1945 when Bob was on leave from the Pacific campaign he wooed Willetta into marrying him in just 11 days! After the wedding, they spent some time on the east coast until Bob was discharged from the Navy. They returned home to Florence and lived north of town for many years. Willetta became a great homemaker and did a local 4-H group with neighbor kids for many years. Bob helped his father at the Florence Feed Store until he saw a calling from the US

Willetta Huntington '43 and Bob Forest Service where he worked until his retirement in the mighty town of Hebo in 1983. Then with a travel trailer in tow they toured parts of Oregon, and down to Arizona for some winter sun, spending time with other family and friends. During their lives, Bob was a fisherman and an avid hunter, killing many elk and deer to provide for the family. Willetta maintained a very nice house and did a good job of keeping three children in tow and having them help with a huge garden and yard.
