Board of Directors proposed changes to SHS constitution and bylaws

This is a notification to the members of the Siuslaw High School Alumni Association that the board of directors has proposed several changes to the bylaws and a simplification to Section D of the constitution. Any changes to either the bylaws or constitution must be accepted by the board of directors then approved by members at the annual meeting. PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL PROPOSED CHANGES ARE IN PARENTHESIS.

•Article II, Section B is to be modified to include guests or graduates. The new wording of Section B. Schedule a meeting annually for past graduates "and their guests" to gather as a group.

•Bylaws Article VII to be changed to allow the appointment of additional At Large Members to fulfill the needs of the board of directors. At Large Members are elected by the board of directors and serve a one-year term subject to reelection at the discretion of the board (four-year board members are approved by the board but require a vote of membership at the annual meeting).

Proposed changes in Article VII of the bylaws relating to At Large Members would read "a minimum of" two At Large members.

**Bylaws Article V to be changed to add that meetings of the board are to be in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order and include the appointment of a parliamentarian to oversee board meeting compliance with the bylaws and adherence to Roberts Rules of Order.

**Proposed changes to bylaws Article V, Section 2: all meetings of the board "in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order". The additional change... the president shall have the power of appointment of members of standing committees and ad hoc committees. "In addition the president shall have the power to appoint a parliamentarian who shall oversee compliance with the bylaws and adherence to Roberts Rules of Order".

**Bylaws Article VII, Section one now reads "The chair of each standing committee shall also serve on the board of directors... this will change to strike the word "standing".
