Silver jubilee of the blue and gold

As the SAA celebrates 25 years of membership, let's take a walk down memory lane: In the spring of 2000, Wanda Ziemer Hoberg contacted Zelda Sanborn Suniga asking for a meeting of the members of the Class of 1950. Mary Lvnn (Mimi) Cooper Smith, Darlene Strahm Rinard, Edna Wolf Jenson, and Ivan Olson joined them at the Valley River Inn, Eugene.

They concluded that it was the duty of the 50year class to sponsor a reunion open to other class years. The Class of 1950 also determined that there was a need for something more permanent to host an all-school reunion. In addition, the Class of 1949, headed by Frank Suniga and Romona Meink Slocum, had continued an annual event by spearheading their 50-year reunion, in which they had an open invitation for other classes to join them.

The classes met in 2000 at the Elks Lodge where Olson presented a draft constitution and bylaws for a Siuslaw High School Alumni Association. These were adopted in September of 2001 at the first association meeting.

The first officers were president Ray Circle, vice president Zane Ziemer, secretary Betty Ryder Olson, and treasurer Wanda Ziemer Hoberg. Olson was named advisor to the board of directors. Ziemer was instrumental in obtaining a charter from the state of Oregon naming the association a nonprofit organization.

The line of presidents for the association are: Ray Circle, Ivan Olson, Zane Ziemer, Andy Nordahl, Len Tabor, Wes Strahm, Lou Anne Wood Fore, and Mike Bones.

The board became aware of a previous incarnation of the same name in a letter dated March 15, 1966. They gave two student loans for a total amount of \$550. Officers were president Don Bowman, vice president Goodren Gallo, secretary Joy Smith, treasurer Dorothy Martin, with the other members being Opal Pitney, Ellen Zimmerman, Letha Carlson, Ole Fosback, and Frank Suniga.

The first few year's meetings were held at the Elks Lodge with an attendance of about 65. The numbers continued to increase, outgrowing the facilities and the meeting was moved to the Three Rivers Casino. The event later moved to the Florence Events Center.

As the primary focus of the association is to provide scholarships to graduates of Siuslaw High School, a scholarship committee was formed. Funds are obtained from individual member contributions, and ticket sales for door prizes and a silent auction, now raffle and dessert dash, held at the annual meeting. Local individuals and merchants provide the products and services. The funds are kept in a Vanguard account that generates interest.

To keep members informed a newsletter called "Sands of Time" was developed. The first editors were Ivan and Betty Olson, followed by Andy and Evelyn Nordahl, Len Tabor, Carolyn Lockwood Nordahl, and currently Jennifer Archer.

Fresh ideas from members will keep the association vibrant for years to come. Any SHS alum is invited to join in on the fun. Any skillset is welcome and we especially appreciate fundraising, event planning, and education. Please inquire with any board member or attend a meeting.

2025 Scholarships Challenge

The Siuslaw Alumni Association is celebrating their 25th anniversary as an association in 2025. Thank you to all of the members for your continued support and encouragement.

Since 2015, the SAA has been honored to award two to three \$3,500 scholarships to Siuslaw High School seniors. This has been accomplished by fundraising efforts, investing, and funds raised during the annual SAA Scholarship Dinner and All-Class Reunion held each September. While the cost of dinner isn't part of the fundraising efforts, the activities during the event and contributions from individual alumni go directly into our scholarship fund.

For the 2025-26 school year, the Siuslaw alumni board is offering this challenge to its members. We have set a goal of \$20,000 for fundraising efforts. If this goal is reached, either an additional amount to the existing three scholarships or a fourth scholarship will be added. This will open up opportunities for another Siuslaw graduate and help aid in their educational costs.
