100 Years Ago

Clipping from The West Newspaper Florence • May 24, 1912

For Safety at Sea- Twenty of the big passenger steamships plying out of San Francisco have been ordered to cut down their passenger lists from 20 to 40 per cent until they are equipped with lifeboats and life rafts sufficient to accommodate all on board is the latest step taken since the Titanic disaster to secure safety at sea.

Similar action has been taken voluntarily by many of the steam ship lines on the Atlantic Ocean also. Never before in the history of marine navigation have life-saving appliances aboard ships been brought to their maximum efficiency so quickly as has been done since the loss of the great White Star liner Titanic.

South Jetty Work to Begin

Colonel Sterling K. Eisiminger, Portland U.S. Army District Engineer, has announced the award of an \$896,500 contract to Natt McDougall Company, 824 Pittock Block, Portland for rehabilitation of the South Jetty at the mouth of the Siuslaw River.

Colonel Eisiminger said the work must be completed in 320 calendar days.

The existing project provides for a navigation channel 12 feet deep across the bar, secured by two rubblemound jetties and a channel in the river 12 feet deep, 200 feet wide to Florence, about five miles, thence 150 feet wide to the town of Cushman, about 2.5 miles.

The jetties were completed in 1917 and the channel in 1929. The north jetty was rehabilitated in 1957. Planning for rehabilitation of the south jetty was started in 1960.

FLORENCE, OR, THURSDAY, AUGUST 30, 1962

Vessel Swamps on South Spit

Robert Amack, 24, and Clifford E. Boyum, 20, both of Florence, clung to the bow of the salmon troller "Sidney" after it was swamped by breakers on the Siuslaw bar last Wednesday afternoon until they were taken aboard the "Otter", operated by Walter Fossek.

The "Sidney" was returning to Florence at about 5 p.m. on August 29 after a day of salmon trolling when a strong north-west wind drove the 20 foot vessel too far south to the south spit. The vessel rode the first breaker, said Amack, but two more broke over the stern, filling it with water. The bow of the boat, with the men clinging to it was buoyed by two empty 60 gallon fuel tanks.

The fifty-fifth annual Rhododendron Festival reached its climax Sunday when an estimated crowd of 25 to 30 thousand people poured into Florence to view the parade.

The parade lasted for one hour and 20 minutes without a dull moment. The floats showed a number of versions of "Those Wonderful Years," the theme of the festival. A sternwheeler river show boat, double decked, with passengers dressed in the show boat era, entered by Florence Auto Parts, took the sweepstakes prize. First place winner in the business section was Safeway Store's entry showing "Those Wonderful Years" of prohibition with "mountain boys" making "mountain dew" or "corn squeezin's."

After the parade, there was the clam chowder feed, a water sports show at Lake Cleawox, the Florence Arts and Crafts show, the antique auto exhibit, the continuous performance of the Gay 90's Meller Drammer at the Civic Theatre and the firemen's contests.

Rural Firemen exhibited their skills at the contests held Sunday afternoon when the Roseburg Rural Fire Department won
