Two-time state champ Coach Flem hangs up whistle

The stands were packed with Viking football fans last November as Siuslaw capped a perfect season with the 3A state championship title. The Viks also played South Umpqua for the state trophy in 1981 but that game resulted in a co-championship.

The team was led by coach **Sam Johnson '13** who learned under **Tim Dodson '82** who learned from Len Lutero. It takes a village to win games and those members are the assistant coaches. They include **Jeff Gray '90**, **William Jones '15**, and **Jerry Fleming '88**, who is retiring after decades of roaming the sidelines.

"I have enjoyed my time coaching offensive and defensive line at Siuslaw. To finish my career coaching my son, Rhys, has been amazing and to coach him in a state championship has been a dream! It really doesn't get any better than that," Jerry said.

He played football while at Southern Oregon University, then worked in law enforcement in Oregon and Alaska. After earning a master's degree from Eastern Oregon University, he begin a career in elementary education working first in the Salem area.

In 1993, he coached as a junior varsity (JV) coach with Lutero, Dodson (his neighbor at the time), Steve Galbraith, and **Randy Fisher '87**.

One of the first dates with his wife, Mary, was a football scouting trip to Myrtle Point.

He was back in Florence to teach and coach in 2006. SHS won the state championship that year too. His oldest daughter, Margot, was a ball girl in the 2011 state final but Jerry was bummed they didn't win it all that year.

When Coach Dodson retired the team struggled but the kids still showed up and played their hearts out. Jerry dedicates the 2021 state title to those boys.

Jerry said, "Now it's time for me to focus on family and teaching second grade here at Siuslaw Elementary. My wife, Mary, has been so supportive of my work in football. I
